ARTICLE I COMMITTEES AND GRAND REPRESENTATIVES

Section 1

The Grand Master elect, after installation, and before closing of the Assembly, shall appoint the following committees, whose term shall correspond with the Grand Master unless by him sooner removed by appointment of his or their successors. The committees are Finance, Jurisprudence, Appeals and Grievance.

Section 1.01 Finance Committee

The Grand Master shall appoint three members to this committee, the chairman shall be the Deputy Grand Master. The Treasurer-Recorder shall be an exofficio member with no voting right.

The duties of the Finance Committee are:

 .01 Budget, recommend and approve the disbursements of the finances.

.02 All resolutions or motions for appropriations shall be referred to this Committee for approval before being voted on by the Assembly.

.03 The Finance Committee, Secretary / Recorder, and Treasurer will submit accepted copies of the books of accounts of the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons of Minnesota to the Board of Trustees for audit who shall then report on such audit at the annual Convocation / Assembly of the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons of Minnesota. Such accepted copies of the books of accounts shall be submitted to the Board of Trustees not less than forty-five (45) days prior to the annual Convocation / Assembly.

Section 1.02 Jurisprudence

.01 The Jurisprudence Committee shall consist of no less than three (3) nor more than five (5) members and shall be chaired by a Past Most Illustrious Grand Master, who will be present at the Annual Assembly, to rule on matters referred to this committee.

 .02 All proposed legislation and decisions of the Grand Master relating to the laws, rules and regulations of the Grand Council shall be referred to this committee for review

 .03 The Committee is to report its recommendations, in writing to the Assembly. A copy of the report to be filed with the Grand Treasurer-Recorder for inclusion in the proceedings

.04 All matters of grievance shall be referred to this committee. This committee shall evaluate all the evidence and facts and report their findings and recommendations to the Grand Master for his decision.

.05 All petitions for restoration from indefinite suspension or expulsion to be referred to this committee.

.06 It shall be the duty of the committee to further Cryptic Masonry in the State of Minnesota by rehabilitating Councils and forming new ones and to contact and cooperate with similar committees of the Grand Chapter and Grand Commandery.

.07 On the receipt of a request for the restoration of a new Council, the Grand Master shall refer the request to the Jurisprudence Committee for examination of the records and report to the Grand Council their recommendations relating to Councils under dispensation and their request for a charter.

Section 3.01 Grand Council Annual Assembly Committee

The Most Illustrious Grand Master shall appoint three (3) members, the Grand Principal Conductor of the Work, shall be one, and is Chairman of the Grand Council Committee, who along with the Grand Chapter Convocation Committee, of which the Grand Scribe is Chairman, are responsible for the arrangements and details relating to the next Grand Assembly, as directed by the Most Illustrious Grand Master. That the Finance Committee shall each year, recommend a dollar sum be budgeted for allocation to the use of this committee. That within (60) days following the Grand Assembly, this committee will prepare a full report for printing in the Proceedings of the Grand Council. This report shall contain a detail of all financial transactions and other pertinent activities and that any remaining dollar balance in its keeping be paid over to the Grand Treasurer, in the percentage received from the Grand Council, for return to the General Fund. The term of this committee shall begin when appointed by the Most Illustrious Grand Master in office and shall conclude upon discharge by the Most Illustrious Grand Master then in office.

Section 5 York Rite Cooperation Committee

The purpose of this Committee is to strengthen the unity and cooperation between the Grand Bodies of the York Rite of Minnesota. This Grand Council Committee shall consist of the Deputy Grand Master (Chairman for the Grand Council Committee), the Grand Captain of the Guard and the Grand Sentinel.

Section 6 Souvenir Program Booklet Committee

A committee on the Souvenir Program Booklet, to consist of one or more members. It shall be the duty of the Committee to send all information pertaining to the purchase of advertisements in the Booklet for the coming Annual Assembly to all subordinate Councils and other Masonic Bodies prior to December 1, of the next Grand Assembly. To secure a printer to print the Booklet. When completed pay over to the Session Committee the net income derived from the Booklet as soon as all the outstanding Booklet accounts have been collected and the Booklet bills have been paid.

The Committee shall give a report on its activities at the Annual Assembly.

Section 7 Grand Representatives

The Grand Master shall appoint well informed Select Masters as Representatives near other Grand Councils, which appoint like Representatives to the Grand Council of Minnesota, and authorize them to extend fraternal greetings and good will to such other Grand Councils, and to protect the interests of the Companions of this jurisdiction, who may be in that Grand Council near which that are so accredited, as occasion may require.

The Grand Master is empowered to remove from office a Grand Representative who has not attended an Annual Assembly for three (3) consecutive years or who do not report on their contacts as Grand Representatives.

Proper commissions certifying such appointments and authority shall be issued to each Representative signed by the Grand Master and the Grand Treasurer-Recorder under the seal of the Grand Council.

ARTICLE II COUNCIL UNDER DISPENSATION

Section 2.01 How Formed

A Council of Cryptic Masons can be formed only by a charter issued by the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons of Minnesota. However, a dispensation may be issued by the Most Illustrious Grand Master between Annual Assemblies upon a petition signed by not less than three (3) or more Companion Royal and Select Masters of known skill and character.

Petition submitted to be in the form shown in "Manual for use by the General Grand Council of Cryptic Masons International".

No dispensation shall be granted by the Grand Master thirty days prior to the Annual Assembly.

Section 2.02 Instituting a Council under Dispensation

A Council under Dispensation shall be instituted as prescribed in the "Manual for Use by the General Grand Council of Cryptic Masons International".

At this time complete operating instructions, in writing, with a list of required paraphernalia, books, forms and record requirements shall be given the Council U. D. (under dispensation) by the Grand Treasurer-Recorder.

Section 2.03 Rights and Privileges

A Council U. D. has all the rights and privileges of a Chartered Council, except

- a) Officers are installed but do not acquire rank.
- b) Cannot receive members by affiliation or restoration
- c) Are not entitled to vote in the Grand Council

ARTICLE III CHARTERED COUNCILS

Section 3.01 Petition for Charter

To be a chartered Council, a Council U. D. must submit a petition for a charter, with the signatures of at least six (6) of its members, at least ten (10) days prior to the Annual Assembly of the Grand Council. The petition must be according to the form provided for in the "Manual for Use by the General Grand Council of Cryptic Masons International".

Section 3.02 Information for Charter

The following must accompany the petition for charter:

- a) The dispensation
- b) Book of Records
- c) Grand Council dues for work done
- d) Additional fee for charter
- e) Copy of the proposed by-laws

Section 3.03 Grand Council Action on Chartered Petition

The Council U. D. will have no further authority until after action has been taken by the Grand Council on the report of the Committee on Jurisprudence. Should the report of the Committee be favorable, a charter will be issued. If not favorable, the Grand Council may continue the dispensation for one more year. If the request for charter is rejected, the Companions who have received the degrees shall be provided, by the Grand Treasurer-Recorder, a certificate of non-affiliation.

Section 3.04 Constituting a Council

When a charter is granted, a Council U. D. shall be constituted as provided in the "Manual for Use by the General Grand Council of Cryptic Masons International". At this ceremony, the new officers, elected and appointed, shall be installed.

ARTICLE X MEETINGS

Section 10.01 Openings, Quorum and Voting

Nine (9) members of the Council must be present to constitute a quorum for business, including an officer entitled to preside. All business must be transacted while open in the degree of Select Master. All questions shall be resolved by a majority vote except as otherwise provided. If nine members are not present, a six (6) member opening is allowable to enable the council members to ballot on petitions and conduct council business using the ritual on file in the Grand Recorders office.

The Grand Council Officers of the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons of Minnesota visiting any subordinate Council of Cryptic Masons of Minnesota's stated meeting may at such said stated meeting serve in the acting role of a member to establish a quorum for the sole purpose of conducting business of such Council of Cryptic Masons of Minnesota. The Grand Officer of Cryptic Masons of Minnesota unless he is a member of such Council of Cryptic Masons of Minnesota serving in the acting role of member does not have voting rights at such Council of Cryptic Masons of Minnesota.

Section 10.02 Frequency of Meetings

Every Council should meet as often as four times per year. If any Council fails to meet once in every year, or shall fail to make returns or pay its per capita or be represented at the Grand Council for two successive years or disobey the laws of the Grand Council, or the order of the Grand Master, it shall thereby forfeit its charter, records, jewels, regalia, furniture, money and all other property to this Grand Council to be taken possession of and disposed of as it may direct, provided that before the Grand Council acts in the matter the delinquent Council shall be notified of the intended action and given an opportunity of being heard in defense. The Grand Master, however, may arrest the Charter of any Council for good cause, which will suspend meetings of the Council until lawfully restored.

Section 10.03 Changes in Date of a Stated Assembly

Should a Constituent Council determine that a day and date specified in its By-Laws be in conflict with a recognized holiday or with another masonic event or celebration over which it has no control, the Constituent Council may, by a motion and its adoption, at the Stated Assembly immediately preceding the usurped date, adjust the day and date of the Stated Assembly by no more than fifteen days to a day and date determined to be more favorable. Provided, however, that the membership of the Constituent Council is informed of the change in date at least 10 days in advance of either the date established by law or the adjusted date, whichever is earlier. Such notification to be by the normally accepted means employed by the Council.

Section 10.04 Annual Returns

Every Council shall make an Annual Return to the Grand Treasurer-Recorder on blanks furnished by him, embracing a report of all gains and losses in membership and other data required concerning the same, during the year preceding commencing January 1st and ending December 31st, said returns duly certified by the Master, and attested by the Recorder with the Council Seal affixed, to be forwarded on or before March 1st, and be accompanied by the required fees and dues. Representative Councils will not be entitled to a vote in the Grand Council unless the requirements are complied with. Councils under U. D. are also required to make a return of work done, and to pay one dollar for each Companion greeted, and if a Charter is desired will forward their books for inspection by the Grand Council.

ARTICLE XII SUSPENSIONS, NON-AFFILIATION DEMIT, AND TRIALS

Section 12.01 Non-payment of Dues

Whenever a member is two years or more in arrears for dues or assessments to his Council, the Recorder shall report the facts to the Council, stating the amount of such arrears and thereupon he, or any member, shall give notice at the same or subsequent stated meeting, that at the next or some future meeting to be named by him, he will move the delinquent be suspended from membership. The Recorder shall make a record of such action and shall immediately give written notice thereof to the delinquent member by mail, addressed to him at his last known address. If such arrears are not paid, a motion may be made at the Assembly indicated, to reject or postpone the suspension. If the motion to suspend finally prevails by a majority vote, the delinquent Companion shall thereupon cease to be a member of such Council.

Section 12.02 Notice to Members in Arrears

No member shall be suspended for non-payment of dues to his Council until after due notice has been given to such member to appear at the time it is proposed to act upon the matter and an opportunity given him to be heard.

Section 12.03 Summons to Show Cause

When a member of a Council is summoned to appear to show cause why he should not be suspended for non-payment of dues, and fails to appear, the Illustrious Master cannot declare him suspended until the Council has so voted.

Section 12.04 Non-affiliation

Section 12.041 Involuntary non-affiliation

Involuntary non-affiliation in a Chapter for six months shall deprive a Council member of his membership in the Council. Due notice thereof will be given by the Grand Recorder.

Section 12.042 Voluntary non-affiliation

Voluntary non-affiliation as used in this section shall apply to those who are on demit from a Chapter, and not those who have been suspended.

Section 12.0430 Demit

Any member of a council in good standing and clear of the books, except the Illustrious Master, Deputy Master or Principal Conductor of the Work, may apply, either in writing filed with the Recorder, or orally at a Stated Assembly, for, and be granted, a demit, without vote, by order of the Illustrious Master, entered upon the minutes, which shall take effect as of the date when the request therefor was filed with the Recorder or so made to the council; and the companion so demitted immediately becomes a non-affiliate, whether the certificate of such demission is immediately issued or not - such certificate being only the written evidence of such demission.

Section 12.0431 In the case of the loss of a demit, upon written application, and showing such loss, a duplicate of demission may issue, by vote of the Council if it is still in existence, or by the Grand Recorder in case the Council is defunct.

Section 12.0432. Any member of a council, except the Illustrious Master, Deputy Master or Principal Conductor of the Work, if in good standing and free from charges, may withdraw from membership therein, by written notice to that effect, filed with the Recorder. Such notice shall be disposed of in the manner and subject to the same conditions as an application for a demit. When such withdrawal is consummated, the record should show that the companion was "dropped from the roll at his own request," He will thereafter be an unaffiliated Cryptic Mason, and have no rights whatsoever, except to petition the Grand Council for restoration, and to defend himself against any charges of unmasonic conduct subsequently made against him, for which he thereafter shall be subject to discipline, as he was before withdrawal.

Section 12.05 Suspension by a Lodge or Chapter

When a Council member has been suspended from a Lodge or Royal Arch Chapter for any reason. and notice of such suspension is received, he shall after due notice, be suspended from the Council. Affiliation in Lodge and Royal Arch Chapter is essential to membership in a Council.

Section 12.06 Restoration

When a member has been suspended from his Council solely because of his suspension from his Chapter, restoration in such Chapter shall entitle him to apply for restoration in his Council, by written application, and such application shall be read at a stated Assembly, and he may be restored by a majority vote at such Assembly.

Section 12.07 Trials

In the matter of trials for unmasonic conduct, and restoration to membership of those who apply after having been suspended or expelled, the same procedure shall be followed as provided for in such cases by the Grand Lodge A.F. & A.M. of Minnesota, so far as applicable.

ARTICLE XIII DUES CARDS

 The Grand Council shall furnish and charge the Constituent Councils for dues cards properly imprinted with their name and number; numbered numerically and carrying the date of the year in which they are issued.

ARTICLE XIV THIRTY-FIVE AND FIFTY YEAR AWARDS

Any Select Master, a member in a Council in Minnesota who has thirty-five (35) years or more of Council membership, shall be entitled to receive from the Grand Council a thirty-five (35) year card evidencing said membership. The Grand Treasurer-Recorder will have available thirty-five (35) year buttons that may be purchased by the Council for presentation at the time the card is presented.

Any Select Master, a member in a Council in Minnesota who has fifty (50) years or more of Council membership, shall be entitled to receive from the Grand Council a fifty-year certificate evidencing said membership. The Grand Treasurer-Recorder will have available fifty (50) year buttons that may be purchased by the Council for presentation at the time the certificate is presented.

ARTICLE XV AWARDS

Section 1. ISH - SODI AWARD

The three principal officers of each council will recommend, prior to January first each year, one Companion from their Council who, in their opinion deserves special commendation for outstanding interest and zeal in promoting Cryptic Rite Masonry, and which member is not at the time one of the three principal or salaried officers of the Council, (remission of dues shall not be considered salary) and it is further provided that he is not one of the three principal Grand Council Officers.

From these recommendations, prior to the Grand Assembly, the three principal Officers of the Grand Council shall select the most worthy to be invested at the Grand Council Assembly, with the title of ISH-SODI with suitable certificate of such award.

660 The Grand Recorder-Treasurer shall keep a permanent record of all 661 recommendations and appointments for the use of succeeding Grand Officers. 662 663 Section 2. CRYPTIC MASON OF THE YEAR AWARD The three (3) principal officers of each Council will recommend, prior to 664 January 1st each year, one Companion from their Council for the General 665 666 Grand award. 667 This award will be made only for exceptional and meritorious service to 668 Cryptic Masonry above and beyond the call of duty. No Past or Present Grand 669 Master, or advancing line officer of the Grand Council shall be eligible for this 670 award. 671 This Companion may also be a nominee for the ISH - SODI Award 672 673 Section 3. ADULT LEADERSHIP AWARD 674 The three (3) principal officers, with the concurrence of the Council, will 675 nominate one Companion or other person, who may be a non-Mason or a 676 female, for this award. 677 This medal will be presented to a nominee who is a leader in one of the youth organizations recognized by the General Grand Council namely; Order 678 679 of DeMolay, Order of Rainbow for Girls, Order of Job's Daughters or Boy or Girl Scouts. 680 681 682 683 Section 4. MINNESOTA YOUTH AWARD 684 Each Council shall nominate one person or a couple that have done an 685 outstanding job working with youth organizations in their activities and promotion of the group. The nominees need not be Masonic affiliated. 686 687 688 689 690 691 692 **ARTICLE XVI AMENDMENTS** 693 694 695 These rules may be amended at any stated Assembly of the Grand 696

These rules may be amended at any stated Assembly of the Grand Council by a majority vote of the Constituent Councils. The vote to be by Constituent Councils and each Constituent Council shall be entitled to one (1) vote for each Dias Officer and Recorder present or by Proxy and one (1) vote for each Past Illustrious Master present; provided he is not an elected Dias Officer or Recorder of a Constituent Council. Then the Past Illustrious Master shall be entitled to only one vote as a Council Dais Officer or Recorder.
