

RULES OF ORDER

- 1. The M∴E∴G∴ H∴P∴ shall take the chair, at the hour to which the Grand Chapter shall convene.
- 2. During the hours of business, the members are required to keep their seats, and observe strict order and decorum, and no member shall leave the hall, or absent himself from the service of the Grand Chapter, unless he has permission, or be sick and unable to attend.
- 3. When the M∴E∴G∴H∴P∴, or presiding officer, rises, all debate shall cease, and silence shall be observed.
- 4. When a member is about to speak, he shall rise from his seat, go to the closest microphone, state his name and Chapter Name and Number and respectfully address the M∴E∴G∴H∴P∴
- 5. The M∴E∴G∴H∴P∴ shall decide all questions of order.
- 6. No member shall speak more than twice upon the same question, unless to explain, without permission of the M∴E∴G∴H∴P∴
- 7. When a question is put, it shall be the duty of every member present to vote, unless excused by the M∴E∴G∴H∴P∴; but no member shall vote on a question in the result of which he is personally interested.
- 8. No motion shall be entertained until it is seconded, and no debate had thereon until it is stated by the Chair.
- 9. Every motion, at the desire of the Chair or Grand Secretary, shall be reduced to writing, with the mover's name endorsed thereon.
- 10. When a question is under debate, no motion shall be received but to adjourn, to lay on the table, to commit, or to amend which several motions shall have precedence in order here mentioned. A motion to adjourn shall always be in order and shall be decided without debate.
- 11. Any member may call for a division of a question, which shall be divided, if it comprehends questions so distinct that one being taken away, the rest may stand entire for the decision of the Grand Chapter; a motion to strike out and insert shall be deemed indivisible.
- 12. No report shall be received from any of the committees of the Grand Chapter, unless the same be reduced to writing. *As amended 1870, page 181*
- 13. No committee shall sit during the sitting of the Grand Chapter, without special leave.
- 14. These Rules of Order, or any part thereof, may be altered, or amended at any Grand Annual Convocation of this Grand Chapter, by a vote of the majority of the members present.

MICHAEL ALAN HILGERT, GRAND HIGH PRIEST 2024-2025

To: The Grand Officers, and Companions of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Minnesota.

Michael Alan Hilgert was born on July 9th, 1963, in Minneapolis, Minnesota. He first lived in Osseo Minnesota (now Maple Grove), then moved to Wayzata at age seven, then on to Brooklyn Park where he graduated from Park Center Sr High with honors in 1981. He was in the VICA program at Park Center allowing him to begin his computer career at Prudential Insurance company in their mainframe data center. In 1985 he joined Target Stores as a Computer Operator and was promoted several times to Performance Analyst. In 1999, he moved to a lake home on Sugar Lake in Wright County. At that time, he accepted a work from home position at IBM Global Services where he was responsible for maintaining the mainframe service level objectives for Xcel Energy and the country of Mexico. In 2001, he created a Home Health Care company and started a Group Home for medically fragile individuals with his soon-to-be wife (now ex-wife). His duties include (but are not limited to) billing, payroll, administration the 401k, bookkeeping, negotiating client service agreements, overseeing maintenance, and other tasks as they come up. He terminated his position with IBM in 2003 when his company formally started providing services. In 2023 he purchased a farmstead outside of Huron, SD where he currently resides. He has 3 doggos (all Labs). He still maintains a home in Minnesota and commutes back and forth as necessary - about 4 1/2 hours each way.

He joined Nelson Lodge No. 135 and was raised to the sublime degree of a Master Mason on December 17th, 2008. He was installed as Master of Nelson Lodge No. 135 on January 5th, 2011. He also has held the offices of Treasurer, Secretary, and LEO at Nelson.

He was appointed a District Representative for the Grand Lodge of MN in 2015 and served until 2018. He was then again appointed in 2020 and served until 2022 when he moved his residence to South Dakota.

He joined St. Johns Chapter No 9 in 2011 and became High Priest in 2014. He currently serves as

St. Johns' Treasurer. He is also a member of St. Cloud Chapter No 10 where he was installed as High Priest on January 30th, 2018. He currently serves as St. Cloud's Secretary and Treasurer. He joined Minneapolis Council No 2 in 2011 and Zabud Council No 10 in 2015 where he became Zabud's Illustrious Master in 2017. He joined Zion Commandery and was Knighted September 17th, 2011. He served as Eminent Commander 2017-2018. He is also a member of Nazarene Commandery No 24 and serves as their Recorder and Treasurer.

He was appointed to the Grand Chapter line at the Grand Session in 2014 by Companion Marvin Schendel, PGHP. Regrettably he had to step out of the Grand Chapter line due to health issues with his then wife (now ex-wife) in 2018. He was appointed Grand Chaplin for the 2018-2019 session. He rejoined the Grand Chapter line and was appointed Grand Captain of the Host by Companion Carl Lidstrom, PGHP at the 2021 Grand Session. He currently is the Grand High Priest of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Minnesota. On October 1st, 2024, he affiliated with the 3 York Rite bodies in Mitchell South Dakota.

He served as a Grand Guard of the Grand Commandery from 2015 until 2019. He joined the Grand Honor Guard on April 26th, 2020, and continues to serve when called upon. He was elected Grand Treasurer for the Grand Commandery on June 24th, 2022, and currently holds that position.

He is also a member of the Minneapolis Valley Scottish Rite and received his 32nd degree on May 20th, 2012. He is a member of the Knights of St. Andrew. He served as Double Eagle for Nelson Lodge from 2013-2015 where his status changed to emeritus due to his Grand Lodge duties.

He became a Shriner on April 28th, 2012, and joined Zuhrah Shrine's Rod and Gun Unit where he served as President from 2019-2021. He is also a member of the St Cloud Shrine Club and Osman Go-Karts.

He has received the Triple Tau award, the Knight of the Royal Arch award, and the Gold Shield award.

He is also a member of other various Masonic bodies: Order of High Priesthood, Thrice Illustrious Master, Knight Crusaders of the Cross, York Rite College, Royal Order of Scotland, Red Cross of

Constantine, Knights of the York Cross of Honour, Holy Royal Arch Knights Templar Priest, Order of Athelstan, Past Commanders Association, Circle of Elders, York Rite Emissary, and Hi-Twelve

Other groups he's a member of: Lotus, Turtles, Order of High Rollers, Order of the NAIL, and The Extraordinarily Secret Order of the Itinerant Masonic Jackasses (charter member).

REPORT OF THE GRAND HIGH PRIEST

To: The Grand Officers, and Companions of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Minnesota.

Right Excellent Companions, Excellent Companions, and Companions all,

It has been my honor and privilege to have represented the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Minnesota as the Grand High Priest during my 2024-2025 term. First and foremost, I would like to thank Companion Marv Schendel, PGHP, for appointing me to the progressive line back in 2014. My journey was a little longer than I had originally anticipated. Due to family health reasons, I had to make the difficult decision to drop out of the Grand Chapter progressive line in 2018. I cannot stress the importance of selfsacrifice to ensure the success of the craft. Dedication and commitment to an Office that you have sworn an oath should not be taken lightly. In 2020, life changes allowed me to rejoin the Grand Chapter line, and I cannot thank Companion Carl Lidstrom, PGHP, enough for giving me the opportunity to continue my journey.

I was able to visit almost every Chapter in the State and would like to thank all the High Priests, Secretaries and Companions for the warm receptions and all the hospitality they offered. I am truly grateful. Due to the inclement weather, I missed going to Halcyon Chapter but still plan on a road trip next time they rotate to their Chapter cycle. I highly encourage all Companions to visit a Chapter other than your own. It is amazing what you can learn and the friendships you can form.

It was an eye-opening experience visiting the Chapters throughout the State. Some of the Chapters functioned like well-oiled machines, while others – not so much. For those Chapters struggling, if there are 6 or more Companions at your meeting, I would highly encourage putting on your aprons and, at a minimum, open on the optional Six Man Opening. Ritual is an important part of what we, as Masons, are all about. That new Companion that just joined your Chapter may

be expecting it. The "old guys" may not show up because the entire meaning of what we do is lost – our zeal and dedication.

I attended South Dakota, North Dakota, and Iowa's Grand York Rite Sessions. I was not able to attend Nebraska's Session this year as it overlapped with Minnesota's Grand Lodge Session. I also attended the North Central Department Conference in Sioux Falls South Dakota and would encourage all Companions to make the trip this year on October 24th and 25th.

This year's Royal Arch One Day Festival was a huge success. We were able to exalt 21 new Companions, and I felt the work was performed extremely well. I'd like to thank the cast of all 4 degrees. With a special thank you to Companion James Zelinski-Feeney for coordinating and providing the educational pieces between the degrees.

As many of you know, at last year's York Rite Grand Session, I had my hair cut into a mullet to raise awareness for the Royal Arch Research Assistance (RARA) and Central Auditory Processing Disorder (CAPD). The objective of the mullet was twofold. First was to start a dialogue, such as "what's up with the hair? The second was the mullet itself. We, as Masons, should always wish to project a decent, moral, and business-like appearance; However, we still need to remember to have a little fun and let our hair down occasionally. This was my theme for the year. We cannot expect our Companions to drive 2-3 hours round trip for a 30 minute business meeting. There needs to be something that makes them want to come back. To feel fulfilled. We can still be all business, but there needs to be fun too. Please, do not just have a 30 minute business meeting and kick everyone out because you have to lock up. Education/enlightenment, decent ritual/degree work, and comradery should be components of every meeting. Everyone leaving that meeting should feel that their time was well spent.

My "Mega Mullet" goal was to raise \$6,000 for RARA. I added a donation incentive that If I received a single donation of \$250 or more, I would match that donation (up to a total of \$3,000). I am happy to report that, with the assistance of Minnesota Chapter #1, St Johns Chapter #9, numerous other Masonic bodies, and individual contributions, the Mega Mullet campaign was able to raise \$6,880.00 for RARA.

For my official duties,

- I granted 6 dispensations for Chapters to move their Stated meetings to different dates.
- I approved the merger of Norther Chapter #82 with Fergus Falls #27.
- I granted dispensation for St Johns Chapter #9 to host the Royal Arch One Day Festival.
- I declared all candidates that submitted a petition on the morning of the Royal Arch One Day Festival eligible to receive the Royal Arch degrees on that day.
- I approved Halcyon Chapter #8 bylaw changes.

I would like to thank all the Grand Officers for all the work they did this year. Especially our Grand Secretary, Companion Joe Anderson, PGHP. He truly deserved the Work Horse Award he was presented last year. His continued dedication to the craft and almost immediate response to any question or request I had made of him, made my term so much easier than I thought it would be. At this year's awards banquet, I was going to present the Work Horse Award to Companion Michael Powles this year. His years of behind the scenes efforts of registration, venue selection, meals, coordination between the 3 bodies, credentials and all the other aspects of putting on a successful session ensured our Grand York Rite Sessions ran flawlessly. However, our Companion Michael went to the Celestial Lodge on March 30th of this year. In his memory, the Work Horse Award has been renamed to the Michael C Powles Work Horse Award. A member of his family will be accepting the award on his behalf. Companion Michael will truly be missed.

In closing, I pray that the upcoming elected and appointed Grand Officers have a successful year and guide, challenge, and improve our York Rite Body, our Chapter, and that the Body acts as a great beacon that its light shines brightly causing a resurgence for all to come to its brightness.

REPORT OF THE GRAND TREASURER

TO: The Most Excellent Grand High Priest, Officers and Members of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Minnesota.

The Profit and Loss Statement for the fiscal year ending May 31, 2025 is attached. We ending the term with a net gain of \$3,139. We had a good turnout with the interest from the Life Membership program and interest in the RBC Investment fund that was deposited. There were three Chapters that did not pay their annual per-capita at the time this report. Among those, only two Chapters did not, officially, turn in a report. Pretty good year. I have used my stipend to pay for any office expenses to save the Grand Chapter any other expenses. We did incorporate the data entry and labor charges to get the MMS off the ground and we (Grand Chapter and Council) did not want to give each Chapter/ Council the burden of dues card printing costs. All this is covered with the our 2023 per capita raise. The Chapter host for the Chapter degrees one day was assessed a building usage fee and the Grand Officers voted to pay that fee.

The Trustees allocated Life Membership earnings of \$15,080 for 2024 which is up slightly from the previous year. The distribution process to the Chapters was modified a few years ago. In the past, the Chapters had to pay per capita on all members. Later they would receive the per capita for the life members from the earnings distribution. This placed a financial burden on some Chapters. Now the Chapters only pay per capita on regular members. The per capita for life members is deducted from the life member earnings before the distribution to the Chapters. This process is appreciated by the Chapters. The earnings are allocated to the Chapters based on the amount of funds they have in the program. If there is not enough allocated to the Chapter to cover the Life Member per capita, the Chapter is not penalized and the Grand Chapter does not receive the full amount of Life Member per capita. See the attached charts for the allocation and distribution of these funds.

See the Finance Committee Report for the proposed budget for the 2025-26 fiscal year.

The financial statements and documents were reviewed on June 9, 2025, and found to be in good order. See attached report.

I thank the Companions for the trust they have bestowed on me as their Grand Treasurer.

Our investment fund has been able to hold a good investment income return and when some funds are maturing this amount is being placed in US Government Secured Money Market for security until our world and market become safe to invest due to world war action and political turmoil, the coronavirus apprehension in investing but our assets were secure and investment income was maintained. Our Life Membership fund is invested in secure funds that draw less interest, but our portfolio is secure. With low interest rates, securities have been prime investments, causing lower interest return. This fluctuation is being controlled using a portion of funds in a fixed return. We feel our broker is competently handling our funds. The rate of return, if figured on the total investment fund of \$635,439.84 is 3.95 %. If it is figured on our recovered financial worth of \$422,829.80 would be 6.65%. We are confident that our investments and counsel are in good condition.



Above is our December 31 statement for verification of our investment funds. We have been investing in above-average interest or dividends for income and still maintain Grade A. Funds verified by EC Ron Jensen and MEC Hugh Swift. All are in order.

The report of investment funds is verification of investment funds. It is the practice of the trustees that no funds are to be handled by the trustees. All money is transferred or dispersed through the Secretary/Treasurer accounts. All jewels and materials are in the Grand Secretary's office for safekeeping.

Investment Funds:

Last year the King Solomon Chapter operating under authority of the Grand Chapter was terminated. Funds that were held by the Grand Chapter in case these chapters wanted to consolidate or become active was held in King Solomon trust so they could be financially able to exist if they reactivated in these funds that are listed in trustees report in the King Solomon's trust. As they also were able to be invested and increase in value and be accountable. Because of termination this item was closed and all funds were returned to the General Fund as they were under the control of Grand Chapter. All funds and material became the property of the Grand Chapter as the consolidating body.

Triennial Fund:

This is a request for funds for delegates to the triennial representing Minnesota. It is a yearly amount of \$900/\$300 per delegate. Since this is an expense and not an income each year \$900 is deducted from the interest to show an annual deduction instead of a large sum every 3 years. It is more fiscally responsible. This year, 3 officers attended the triennial, so 2700 was deposed. This will be in trust for next triennial.

Charity Fund:

This fund has been capped at \$26,311.24. All interest has been used for charitable purposes. This is under the direction of the GHP or his committee.

Life Membership:

This is proposed membership that was established to assist delinquent members. The formula because of the new system of records has to be revised for age and payment factor. All money is deposited in Life Membership Fund.

Our investments and resources are financially solvent and in good condition. Our broker has followed the proposed handling of funds that maintain a good return but with a conservative level of risk. Our brokers have a working knowledge of our needs and dispersal of funds. We have an excellent relationship with their service and ability. To better serve a portfolio in bonds and stocks with grade A quality, our broker changed his brokerage dealer to IAA, Internal Assets Advisory. Our clearinghouse is IBC. Due to untimely validation of ownership, our transfer was delayed causing money flow to be delayed. This was reflected in an increase in income from 2020 year. Our new brokerage firm is Financial Advantage Wealth Management LLC of Fargo, ND. They are Richard Engen, President and Jeff Wallgren, Investment Executive. Our new group has a station in the twin cities, which makes handling legal papers much easier and faster for the trustees and secretary/treasurer. I have met with them and been assured by their proposals and information that they know and understand our goals and institution.

Any matters that are of a constitutional or regulation nature are transferred to the jurisdiction committee for a ruling. We find the Grand Chapter to be in good condition and in good hands. The trustees try to be fiscally responsible for dispersing or establishing needs of the Grand Chapter to make sound financial policy.

We draw attention to the budget report, which is our guide of the income that is needed to cover our expenses. ARTICLE XI

Whatever the current membership data system in use authorized by the Grand York Rite Bodies

Section 1. Current membership data system.

The authorized membership data system authorized by the Grand York Rite Bodies will be the official digital repository of all membership records of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Minnesota.

Section 2. Use of Data/Content.

Anyone granted access will agree that the use of the data is only as intended by the membership data system. Each individual granted access to data holds a position of trust and must preserve the security and confidentiality of the information he/she uses or accesses. Users are required to abide by all applicable Federal and State guidelines and Masonic policies regarding confidentiality of data. Any individual with authorized access to data must not divulge this information outside except for approved Masonic business. You may not use or export or re- export any content or any copy or adaptation of such content, in violation of any applicable laws or regulations, including without limitation United States export laws and regulations.

Section 3. Users Must:

- A. Access data solely in order to perform his/her responsibilities.
- B. Not seek personal benefit or permit others to benefit personally or professionally from any data.
- C. Not permit unauthorized use of any information.
- D. Not enter, change, delete or add data to any record outside of the scope of his/her responsibilities.
- E. Not include or cause to be included in any record or report, a false, inaccurate or misleading entry known to the user as such.
- F. Not alter or delete or cause to be altered or deleted from any records, report or information system, a true and correct entry.
- G. Not release data other than what is required in completion of his/her responsibilities.
- H. Not exhibit or divulge the contents of any record or system information to any person unless it is necessary for the completion of their responsibilities.

Section 4. Your Login and Password.

A. To protect the account information of our users, you are assigned a unique user name. These unique identifiers are disclosed only to you. You are responsible for maintaining the confidentiality of your account and password and for restricting access to your computer, and you agree to and accept sole responsibility for any and all activities that occur under your account or password. You agree to notify the Grand Secretary immediately of any unauthorized use of your account or password, or any other breach of security. However,

you may be held liable for losses incurred to the system or any other user of or visitor to the site due to someone else using your user login and password.

Section 5. High Priest Responsibilities:

- A. Shall ensure the utilization of the membership data system to manage all membership records of the Chapter in a timely manner.
- B. If necessary: May designate one Information Technology (IT) Representative to assist with managing a chapter's membership records and will comply with Section 6 Chapter Secretary Responsibilities.
- C. Shall notify the Grand Secretary immediately of any changes to the office of Secretary or IT Representative in order that old accounts may be deactivated, and new accounts established.

Section 6. Chapter Secretary Responsibilities:

- A. Shall take and be familiar with any training offered by the membership data system administrators and the Grand Secretary's office in order to be able to utilize all aspects of the system.
- B. Shall be responsible for maintaining all chapter membership records in the data, making necessary changes within 30 days of their occurrence.
- C. Shall annually, within 30 days of the installation of officers, update the list of officers of the Chapter.
- D. Secretaries and IT Representatives shall log in to the membership data system no less than monthly to maintain access credentials and to make any approved membership changes.
- E. Shall submit to the Grand Secretary a list of all remissions for the reporting year by December 31 each year. Remissions shall include member's full name and type of remission, i.e., Health/Other, or 50-Year Member. Failure to submit remissions list to Grand Secretary by the due date will negate any credits for remissions in the Annual Return calculations for the reporting year.

Section 7. Grand Secretary Responsibilities:

- A. Shall manage and monitor all user accounts, coordinating with System Administrators for all activations and deactivations in a timely manner.
- B. Shall annually, within 30 days of the installation of officers, update the list of grand officers of the Grand Chapter.
- C. Shall report to the Grand High Priest any deficiencies in utilization of the membership data system by any Chapter.
- D. Shall run an Annual Statistical Report for each Chapter immediately following the close of the reporting year.
- E. Shall generate a bill for each Chapter based on the Annual Statistical Report of each Chapter, and which shall include all applicable credits and debits, in accordance with ARTICLE III, Subordinate Chapters, Section 24. Annual Returns., presenting said bill to the Chapter Secretary no later than January 15th, of which should be turned in by the Chapter Secretary, with payment, no later than February 15th.
- F. Shall not allow any prior year corrections in a billing cycle due to the failure of any Chapter Secretary or IT Representative to manage and maintain their membership records.
