As the Grand Treasurer, it has been my continued honor to be entrusted to manage the financial records for the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Minnesota.

During this past year, I was able to upgrade our QuickBooks financial software to the latest supported desktop version – 2024. This is the last year the desktop version is being supported.

Working with our Grand Recorder to get our Constituent Commandery's annual assessments and Life Membership distributions entered into our financial software, it became apparent that a more streamlined process could be implemented. For this Grand Session, I proposed legislation that would credit the annual assessment for the amount of the distribution instead of mailing a check in mid-May. The proposed legislation would also change the close date of the Life Membership Fund to December 31st to coincide with the MMS year end assessments. Changing the date would also make the distribution amount extremely transparent using our fund manager's YTD financial statement.

Also, this past year I served on the Investments and on the Financial and Budget committees.

It would be my honor to continue to serve the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Minnesota as its Grand Treasurer for the ensuing year – With the approval of the Nominating Committee and the Sir Knights present at the Annual Conclave.

Sir Knights All,

At the beginning of this committee year, the Knights Templar Eye Foundation Committee was in a position of exceptional strength. The prior year's fundraising effort, centered on the specially designed KTEF challenge coin, demonstrated broad support across the Grand Commandery of Minnesota. Five hundred individually numbered coins were cast and sold, with Grand Commandery officers, constituent commanderies, lodges, and individual Sir Knights contributing to the effort. That campaign helped Minnesota achieve the status of a 100% Life Sponsor State of the Knights Templar Eye Foundation, a significant accomplishment reflecting both the generosity of the Sir Knights of Minnesota and the continued vitality of the Foundation's mission.

Because of that strong prior-year performance, the committee did not need to take additional formal action during the 2025–2026 committee year. The committee entered the year with its principal objective already accomplished and with the Foundation well supported by the success of the previous campaign. Additionally, the committee continues to hold a balance of nearly \$3,000 in a committee-specific account. These funds remain available as seed money for future fundraising efforts, allowing the committee to begin its next project from a position of financial readiness rather than starting from zero.

Taken together, these facts show that the Knights Templar Eye Foundation Committee remains healthy, stable, and well-positioned for continued service. The prior year's work produced a lasting achievement for Minnesota Templary, the current year required no corrective or emergency action, and the committee retains dedicated funds to support future fundraising. Looking ahead, the committee chair for the 2026–2027 year has already proposed another fundraising campaign to further support the Knights Templar Eye Foundation. The committee, therefore, closes this year not only with gratitude for what has already been accomplished but also with confidence that the next committee year will continue to build on that success.

There have been instances in the past where subordinate Commanderies have not deposited Life Membership distribution checks in a timely manner. Or a subordinate Commandery has not paid their Annual Assessment in a timely manner. Distributions going to subordinate Commanderies were paid on or before May 30 of each year. With assessments now being issued in early January, and being required to be paid with the Annual Return by March 15 of each year, it doesn't make sense to assess a charge to the subordinate Commandery and then issue a distribution check. The annual assessment would be reduced by the Life Membership distribution, possibly improving the subordinate Commandery's cashflow at the beginning of the year.
