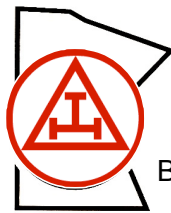

RULES OF ORDER

1. The M.:E.:G.: H.:P.: shall take the chair, at the hour to which the Grand Chapter shall convene.
2. During the hours of business, the members are required to keep their seats, and observe strict order and decorum, and no member shall leave the hall, or absent himself from the service of the Grand Chapter, unless he has permission, or be sick and unable to attend.
3. When the M.:E.:G.:H.:P.:, or presiding officer, rises, all debate shall cease, and silence shall be observed.
4. When a member is about to speak, he shall rise from his seat, go to the closest microphone, state his name and Chapter Name and Number and respectfully address the M.:E.:G.:H.:P.:
5. The M.:E.:G.:H.:P.: shall decide all questions of order.
6. No member shall speak more than twice upon the same question, unless to explain, without permission of the M.:E.:G.:H.:P.:
7. When a question is put, it shall be the duty of every member present to vote, unless excused by the M.:E.:G.:H.:P.:; but no member shall vote on a question in the result of which he is personally interested.
8. No motion shall be entertained until it is seconded, and no debate had thereon until it is stated by the Chair.
9. Every motion, at the desire of the Chair or Grand Secretary, shall be reduced to writing, with the mover's name endorsed thereon.
10. When a question is under debate, no motion shall be received but to adjourn, to lay on the table, to commit, or to amend which several motions shall have precedence in order here mentioned. A motion to adjourn shall always be in order and shall be decided without debate.
11. Any member may call for a division of a question, which shall be divided, if it comprehends questions so distinct that one being taken away, the rest may stand entire for the decision of the Grand Chapter; a motion to strike out and insert shall be deemed indivisible.
12. No report shall be received from any of the committees of the Grand Chapter, unless the same be reduced to writing. – *As amended 1870, page 181*
13. No committee shall sit during the sitting of the Grand Chapter, without special leave.
14. These Rules of Order, or any part thereof, may be altered, or amended at any Grand Annual Convocation of this Grand Chapter, by a vote of the majority of the members present.

SCOTT FORD WOOD, GRAND HIGH PRIEST 2025-2026

To: The Grand Officers, and Companions of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Minnesota.

Scott Ford Wood was born on July 2, 1973, in Pensacola, Florida. At the age of 3, he moved with his mother and two brothers to Hattiesburg, Mississippi, so his mother could complete her Doctorate at the University of Southern Mississippi. In the summer of 1980, Scott's family moved to Richmond, Virginia. As a youth, Scott participated in Scouts, and played soccer and tennis, as well as concert / jazz alto and tenor saxophones. He also studied Karate, Tae Kwon Do, Tai Chi and holds a 1st Degree Black Belt in Kuk Sool Won. In the summer of 1989, he participated in American Music Abroad, touring and playing many concerts across Europe. Scott graduated from Midlothian High School in 1991, and attended Virginia Commonwealth University, where he earned his Bachelor of Science in Communications and Public Relations. In the 1990's, Scott served as VP of Publishing for his family's education consulting and publishing business. In the early 2000's, he managed several restaurant start-ups in Richmond, VA.

Scott moved to Minnesota in December of 2004 and began working at the Science Museum of Minnesota, where he spent the next seven years. In 2008, Scott was accepted into the University of Minnesota's Carlson School of Management MBA program and pursued studies in Supply Chain Management and a certificate with the Medical Industry Leadership Institute. On October 2, 2009, Scott married the love of his life, Kari. Their son, Sam, was born on March 16, 2011. For the past 14 years, Scott has been with Xcel Energy and manages a capital projects sourcing team across the company's eight-state service area. Scott's family lived in the St. Paul Midway until 2014 before they moved to their current home in Edina, MN.

At home, Scott is an avid gardener, beekeeper, and enjoys woodworking and restoring classic cars (currently working on a 1960 Austin Healey Bugeye Sprite). Additionally, he has been active in Scouts since 2016 with his son, Sam, and served as Scoutmaster for Edina Troop 123 from 2023-2026.

Scott was initiated, passed and raised to the sublime degree of a Master Mason on November 23, 2010, in Cataract Lodge No. 2 in Minneapolis, MN. He served as Master of the Lodge from 2017-2018 and is currently serving a second term as Master of Cataract Lodge.

Scott joined the Minneapolis Valley of the Scottish Rite in 2012 and was invested with the Rank and Decoration of Knight Commander of the Court of Honour on October 25, 2025. Scott currently serves as Venerable Master of the Minneapolis Valley Lodge of Perfection.

In 2014, Scott joined the York Rite bodies of Minneapolis. He has served as High Priest of St. John's Chapter No. 9 (2018-2019), Illustrious Master of Minneapolis Council No. 2 (2020-2022), and Eminent Commander of Zion Commandery No. 2 (2021-2022). In 2019, Scott was appointed to the Grand Chapter line by MEC R. James Luchsinger II. In 2021,

Scott was appointed to the Grand Commandery line by REGC Joseph J. Anderson and is currently serving as Eminent Grand Junior Warden.

REPORT OF THE GRAND TREASURER

TO: The Most Excellent Grand High Priest, Officers and Companions of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Minnesota.

The Profit and Loss Statement for the fiscal year ending May 31, 2026 is attached. We ended the term with a net gain of \$2,433.55. We had a lower than normal turnout with the interest from the Life Membership program and interest in the RBC Investment fund that was deposited. There was one Companion that purchased a life membership and one that was transferred to another Chapter's fund. Also, because of the merging of Kitson Chapter #101 to Fergus Falls Chapter #27, #27 will receive #101's distribution check. There were two Chapters that did not pay their annual per-capita at the time this report. But I was able to use the member data from MMS to tally the counts. Pretty good year. As of now, in keeping our data system active (MMS) the Grand Chapter has paid all costs associated with using the system and this does include the printing and mailing of the dues cards. All of this was covered with the our 2023 per capita raise.

The Chapter host for the Chapter degrees one day was assessed a building usage fee and the Grand Officers voted to pay that fee of \$300. This will likely continue moving forward.

The Trustees allocated Life Membership earnings of \$12,000 for 2025 which is down from the previous year mainly because of a low performance of our investments. The distribution process to the Chapters was modified a few years ago. In the past, the Chapters had to pay per capita on all members. Later they would receive the per capita for the life members from the earnings distribution. This placed a financial burden on some Chapters. Now the Chapters only pay per capita on regular members. The per capita for life members is deducted from the life member earnings before the distribution to the Chapters. This process is appreciated by the Chapters. The earnings are allocated to the Chapters based on the amount of funds they have in the program. If there is not enough allocated to the Chapter to cover the Life Member per capita, the Chapter is not penalized and the Grand Chapter does not receive the full amount of Life Member per capita. See the attached charts for the allocation and distribution of these funds. The investments will be fully viewed by the trustees this Summer to see any other means that would be in our best interest.

See the Finance Committee Report for the proposed budget for the 2026-27 fiscal year.

The financial statements and documents were reviewed on May 28, 2026 in the Grand office, and found to be in good order. See attached report.

I thank the Companions for the trust they have bestowed on me as their Grand Treasurer.

Thanks to the help of the Chapter Secretaries for keeping great records and all of the hard work that goes into keeping your data and doing the research it takes to keep it updated. All in all, as in all other Masonic bodies, membership dropped but the overall percentage was less and much less than last year. We had a net loss of 52 companions in 2025. Unfortunately, we had more deaths than exaltations, which, unfortunately, is usually the case. The summary for the year is:

I am very pleased to say that only two chapter's did not turn in their report. I presumed no changes from 2025 so that is how I entered it.

Our new data system has treated us well and will be a benefit for us as we move on to a cleaner information system and data entry. The Masonic Membership Solutions offers many different data factors, tallys and data information at your fingertips. I am always available to the Secretaries if any questions on its usage. The data transfer into the merging Chapter's has been seamless thanks to the help of the headquarters team. Digging into paper records has still been necessary to enter the proper date records and many many more need to be done by our Secretaries to get the records as accurate as we can. We do need to fix the default entries of the 1/1/1900.

I have attached detailed gains and losses and reported Exaltations and Deaths by Chapter.

For the Secretaries, you should still keep your spreadsheets updated, just to make sure it all matches up. I trust that the Secretaries will keep the MMS updated so that we can rely on the MMS data for our 2025 annual returns. Kittson #101 merged in with Fergus Falls #27 earlier in the year. All Companions were transferred in MMS.

An email was sent to each of the chapter secretaries requesting an updated bylaws of their chapter. All but five has been received.

New Royal Arch ritual books were printed and most were purchased by the chapter. I do have some available, along with the Mark Master packets at \$10 each.

Unfortunately there has been talk about other Chapter's merging. Companions, we must retain our members and bring new ones into our York Rite so we can keep us a strong, viable entity.

Please enjoy the charts created and posted in this proceeding of all of the existing Minnesota Chapters and all of our Minnesota Grand High Priests. These will be posted on the website.

It has been a pleasure to serve as your Grand Secretary. A special shout out to all of the Chapter secretaries and their hard work and perseverance in keeping their Chapters thriving and all the Companions joining in.

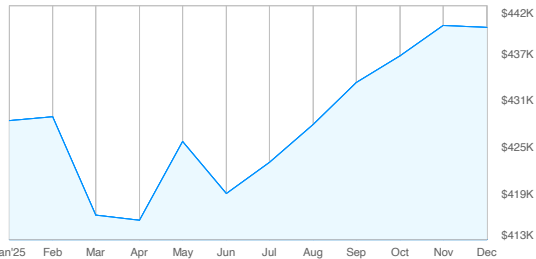

The Secretary/Treasurer accounts have been reviewed and verified. The report of investment funds is verification of investment funds. It is the practice of the trustees that no funds are to be handled by the trustees. All money is transferred or dispersed through the Secretary/Treasurer accounts. All jewels and materials are in the Grand Secretary's office for safekeeping.

Triennial Fund:

This is a request for funds for delegates to the triennial representing Minnesota. It is a yearly amount of \$900/\$300 per delegate. Since this is an expense and not an income each year \$900 is deducted from the interest to show an annual deduction instead of a large sum every 3 years. It is more fiscally responsible. This year (2026), 3 officers will be attending the triennial, depleting our allocated \$2,700, thus \$900 will be transferred/deposited to start the next triennial cycle.

Charity Fund:

This fund has been capped at \$26,311.24. All interest has been used for charitable purposes. This is under the direction of the GHP or his committee.

Life Membership:

This is proposed membership that was established to assist delinquent members. The formula because of the new system of records has to be revised for age and payment factor. All money is deposited in Life Membership Fund.

Our investments and resources are financially solvent and in good condition. Our broker has followed the proposed handling of funds that maintain a good return but with a conservative level of risk. Our brokers have a working knowledge of our needs and dispersal of funds. We have an excellent relationship with their service and ability. To better serve a portfolio in bonds and stocks with grade A quality, our broker changed his brokerage dealer to IAA, Internal Assets Advisory. Our clearinghouse is Charles A Schwab. Our new brokerage firm is Financial Advantage Wealth Management LLC of Fargo, ND. They are Richard Engen, President and Jeff Wallgren, Investment Executive. Our new group has a station in the twin cities, which makes handling legal papers much easier and faster for the trustees and secretary/treasurer. I have met with them and been assured by their proposals and information that they know and understand our goals and institution.

Any matters that are of a constitutional or regulation nature are transferred to the jurisdiction committee for a ruling. We find the Grand Chapter to be in good condition and in good hands. The trustees try to be fiscally responsible for dispersing or establishing needs of the Grand Chapter to make sound financial policy.

We also want to remind companions that if additional programs as expenses are necessary it can only be achieved by increasing per capita. We draw attention to the budget report, which is our guide of the income that is needed to cover our expenses. REPORT OF THE GRAND LECTURER

TO: The Most Excellent Grand High Priest, Officers and Members of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Minnesota

It was an honor to serve as Grand Lecturer for the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Minnesota.

I accepted the appointment shortly after undergoing a three-disc cervical fusion in my neck. Entering the term, I knew there would be challenges ahead, both physically and Masonically. Around the same time, I was also appointed as a District Representative

for the Grand Lodge of Minnesota, adding further obligations and responsibilities throughout the year.

In truth, I began the term somewhat underprepared for the full scope of the office. When accepting the position, I operated under the assumption that securing participating Chapters for the One Day Festivals would largely be a matter of routine confirmation. I underestimated the amount of coordination, communication, and follow-up required to secure commitments from the various Chapters. As other obligations and responsibilities demanded attention, this resulted in delays in finalizing participation. Thankfully, through persistence and the cooperation of our Companions across the state, the necessary commitments were ultimately secured, though later than the Grand High Priest would have preferred.

One of my primary responsibilities during the festivals was to provide instruction and education to candidates between degrees. My original intention had been to create a series of PowerPoint presentations to assist in those efforts. However, after seeking counsel from experienced Companions, it was suggested that a more direct and conversational approach would be sufficient. At the time, I accepted that advice gratefully, particularly amidst an already demanding schedule and increasing burnout, as it removed a significant amount of preparation work from my plate.

Upon arriving at the Royal Arch Festival, however, I found myself wishing I had followed through with those presentations after all. I believe visual and structured educational aids would have enhanced the experience for the candidates and better supported the instructional portions of the day.

As a result, I have resolved that for the 2027 festival season, I will prepare and provide presentation materials not only for Royal Arch Masonry, but likewise for Grand Council and the Knights Templar festivals as well, regardless of title or station at that time. While my interaction with candidates was more limited during the Council Festival and nearly absent during portions of the Templar Festival, the experience reinforced for me the importance of providing clear, memorable instruction to every candidate entering the York Rite.

Despite the challenges of the year, I remain grateful for the opportunity to serve the Grand Chapter and for the patience, counsel, and support offered by so many Companions throughout the jurisdiction. The lessons learned this year will undoubtedly strengthen future efforts and improve the experience for both candidates and officers alike.
